

3.1 Demographic Profile

- It is estimated that there were 37,806 children and young people aged 0 to 19 living in North East Lincolnshire in 2018.
- 0-19 make up approximately 23.7% of NEL's population. Of these, around 30.4% are in the 0-5 age group and 74.8% in the 5-19 age group.
- Within the 0-19 population, 50.8% are boys and 49.2% girls.

North East Lincolnshire population pyramid by 5 year age group and sex, numbers, 2018





Demographic Profile

 8.9% of pupils in schools in NEL (covered by the School Census) are from a minority ethnic background.

 The 2011 census indicated that North East Lincolnshire was less diverse in terms of religious belief than Yorkshire and the Humber and England.

Percentage of pupils in NEL from a minority ethnic origin in January 2019, regional and national comparison



Demographic Profile

- The overall 0-19 population is projected to decrease over the 25 year period 2016-2041 by 11.4%.
- Within that same time period, the 0-5 population is projected to decrease by 16.4% and the 5-19 population is projected to increase slightly (3.6%) until 2024, before declining by around 12.5%.
- Planned economic growth over the next 15 years is likely to mean growth in working-age and CYP populations and may impact on the reliability of these projections.

3.2 Deprivation

- The new Indices of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) for 2019 ranked NEL as the 29th most deprived local authority in England (using the average score measure).
- 32 (30%) of LSOAs in NEL are in the most deprived 10% of LSOAs in England

 we have the 17th highest proportion of LSOAs in the most deprived 10% of LSOAs nationally.
- 11 LSOAs in NEL are in the most deprived 1% of LSOAs in England.
- A more detailed analysis of IMD is presented in Module 8 under 'social factors'.
